

Cars in the collection are from all over the

world. No matter how long you have been into cars, there are vehicles in this collection you have never seen in person. Dezerland Park, housed in an 850,000-square-foot former mall, also features indoor go-karts, bowling, minigolf, and pinball machines, as well as several other entertainment distractions.

Members and guests are welcome to attend the board meetings or, once more, spend time enjoying the area. A banquet at the host hotel that night wraps up our Winter Reunion & Board Meetings event.
